

- 3 decision rounds per year
- **Medium** Grants: Up to £10k
 - project development up to RIBA Stage 1
 - essential repairs costing upto £80k
- Large Grants: Up to £50k
 - urgent structural repairs costing over £80k
 - new facilities (kitchens/toilets) over £30k



Eligibility

The application begins with an eligibility quiz.

- ✓ A Christian place of worship within in the UK
- ✓ Originally built as a place of worship (over 30 years ago) and open for regular public worship
- ✓ At least <u>50% funds</u> raised
- ✓ Open at least 100 days per year or within 1 year of completion
- ✓ Leading qualified professional with <u>conservation accreditation</u> if listed
- ✓ Necessary <u>permissions</u> and <u>multiple quotes</u> in place
- ✓ Work not yet started




What we don't fund

- Approximately 30% applications are ineligible at the outset
- We don't fund:
 - Works to the churchyard, boundary walls, car parks, paths
 - Repairs to heating and boilers
 - Reordering, lighting, electricity, audio-visual equipment
 - Repairs or maintenance for clocks, organs, bells, monuments
 - Restoration of wall paintings, stained glass (unless urgent repairs to window structure)
 - New builds




Medium Grants (Project Development)

- Awards of upto £10,000
- Project development up to RIBA Stage 1
- E.g. feasibility studies, option appraisals, detailed reports to better understand an issue
- 2 quotes and 50% funds for this element
- Support from lead professional (CA)




Medium Grants (Maintenance and Repair)

- Awards upto £10,000
- Essential repairs costing upto £80,000
- E.g. roof repairs, masonry repairs, rainwater goods ideally identified in a recent Five Year Inspection Report/survey
- 2 quotes and 50% funds in place
- Permissions
- Conservation accredited lead professional (or support for small projects)



Large Grants

- Awards of between £10,000 and £50,000
- Urgent structural repairs costing over £80,000
- New facilities (kitchens & toilets) over £30,000
- Two stage Process
- Tendered or QS Costs and 50% funding in place
- Permissions
- Conservation Accredited Professional if church is listed






Whether you are looking to repair your roof, install a kitchen or accessible toilets, clear asbestos or simply need help undertaking regular essential maintenance to your building, we offer a range of grants to suit the size and needs of your project.

Large grants

Large grants for urgent structural repair projects and for projects to install kitchens and toilets.



Treasure Ireland grants

Medium grants

We will also consider projects that introduce kitchers and accessible toilets to enable increased community use, costed at more than \$30,000 including VAT Grants will never exceed \$0% of the project cost.

Welcome to the National Churches Trust's Grant Application Site

Our grants are evaluable to support work to church buildings throughout the UK that fulfill the eligibility criteria. We can fund maintenance work, repair work, installation of kitchens and accessible toilets, and some project development work. You must have 50% of funds in place, permissions secured and valid (unless yours is a project development scheme), and a qualified professional leading the project (conservation accredited if the building is listed). Our grants will never exceed 50% of the project costs.

As demand regularly exceeds the funds we have available, we have to limit the serts of projects we can consider. If your project is not eligible we have that the information on our website with alternative sources of funding, as we'll as other resources and buildings advice pages, will be helpful to you.

Please note that we place a strong emphasis on maintenance and being open. We encourage all applicants and grantees to have a maintenance plan and require grantees to be open more than 100 days a year and to feature on our Explore map. 





- Make sure your **figures are clear**
- Submit all required documentation
- Lead with the need
- Celebrate your successes
- Go into detail







Check out the progress on our new roof!

Our general manager Naomi has been up on the roof this morning to look at the amazing progress on this incredible project which is due to be completed by the end of April.

The complex double-pitched roof on our Grade II* listed Georgian meeting house is being completely stripped and re-laid. New breathable insulation is being installed which will protect against damp build-up and prevent heat from escaping, leading to both lower energy bills and a reduced carbon footprint for the museum and meeting

Additionally, we are installing solar panels on the inner pitches of the roof, thus preserving the historic integrity of the building from the outside, but also allowing us to further lower our
